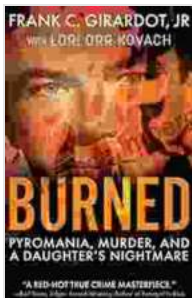


Burned: Pyromania, Murder, and a Daughter's Nightmare

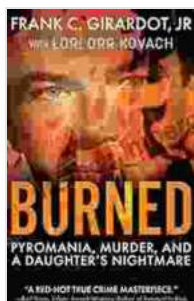

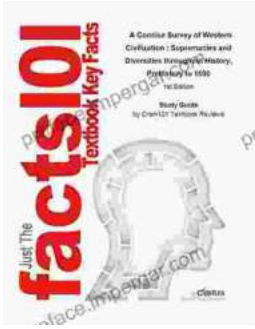

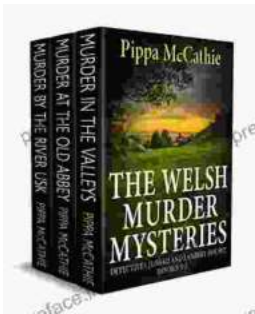
