
Plundering the World's Marine Life



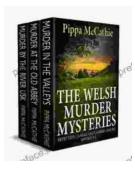
